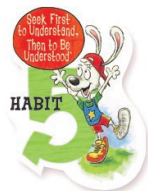
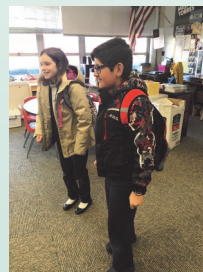
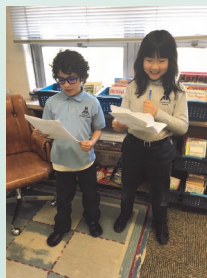
Mind. Body. Spirit. Heart.

Third grade students rehearse their play to demonstrate one of the Seven Habits.

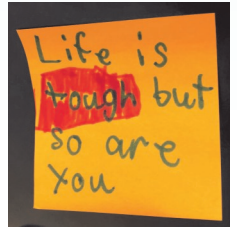
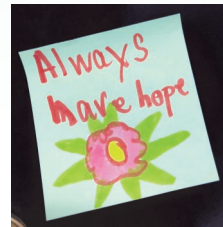
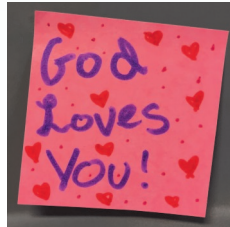
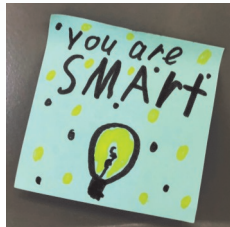
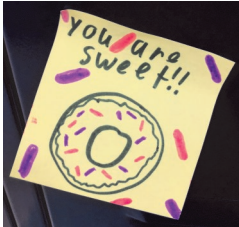
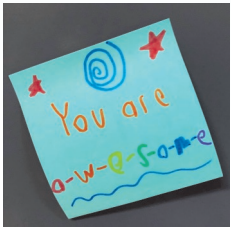

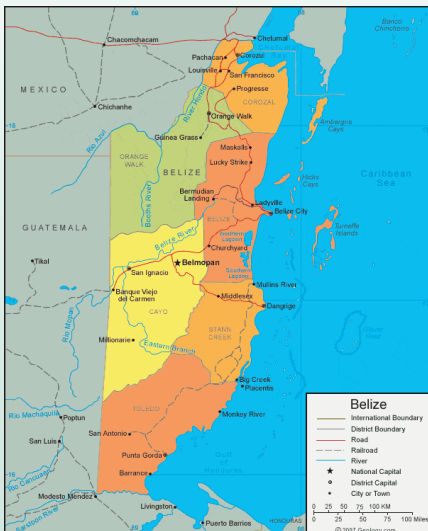
Mission: Belize
