We were blessed to welcome Pastor Aaron Mace, of the Burr Ridge SDA Church, as our Fall Week of Prayer speaker. Each day Pastor Mace held sessions for Preschool-4th, 5th-8th, and high school where he shared stories of his life and lessons from the Bible. As a former army paratrooper, Pastor Mace had many exciting stories to share with the students and was able to describe various ways he encountered God during his time in Iraq and beyond. Some highlights from his talks included how God spoke directly to him through his phone when he was literally lost,

using the experience of parachuting as a metaphor for following & trusting God, his use of alliteration to help the high school students remember key words from the message, and high fives for everyone as they left each day. Pastor Mace is a dynamic speaker and was able to connect with HAA students in a way that drew them closer to Christ.

Perhaps the best part of the week for everyone happened on Friday. At the end of his sessions Pastor Mace asked students to indicate if God was calling them to baptism or a renewed commitment and over 20 students responded.

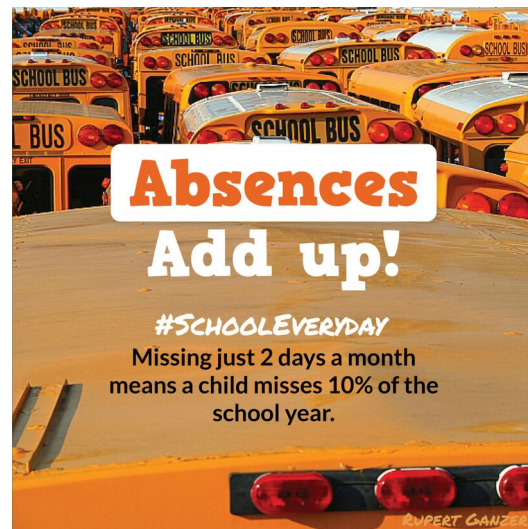

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE MAKES A DIFFERENCE

- Many of the youngest students miss 10 percent of the school year—about 18 days a year or just two days every month.
- Chronic absenteeism in kindergarten, and even preK, can predict lower test scores, poor attendance and retention in later grades, especially if the problem persists for more than a year.
- If children don't show up for school regularly, they miss out on fundamental reading and math skills and the chance to build a habit of good attendance that will carry them into college and careers.
- Data show that children who are chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade are far less likely to read proficiently at the end of 3rd grade.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school leads to poor overall attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.
- School begins at 8:00 a.m. every day at HAA and dismisses at 3:15 M-Th, 2:00 on Fridays
